

Is My Child Ready for Algebra?

A parent-guide companion. Algebra readiness is whether they understand the idea or only follow the steps. Use this checklist, then run the live check.

Parent checklist

- If you cover the worked example, can they still say what the idea is for?
- Does a graph or a table of the same relationship feel like a new topic?
- When an outside test disagreed with homework grades, which one did you trust?
- Are you looking for a label, or for a starting point?

What the live check covers

The live Provetree Readiness Check samples Algebra Foundations, the core moves of early algebra a learner needs before Algebra 1. Combining like terms, one-step equations, the distributive property, and reading a linear relationship are the kind of ideas in that set. Each concept is shown in more than one form. The learner gets one pick at each form, then names the rule.

How to interpret the Readiness Check

The parent report lists each concept as solid or needing practice, and whether the learner was following the steps or holding the idea. It also recommends a starting pack and a difficulty band. It does not print a named misconception sentence, and it is not a diagnosis or a grade-level certification. Provetree is practice and a game, not a school.
